



**The ability to write a disc from Windows Explorer was added in Windows Xp.**  
The procedure was enhanced and improved when you move on to Win7.

### **Using Windows Explorer on XP to write to a CD**


1) Insert a blank CD




2. Close any windows that might open.




3) Select your documents that you want to burn



Right Click  
Select Send To  
Select the drive containing the target CD




You now have a notification that files are waiting to be burned to the CD.




Click on the **Write These files to CD** on the right hand panel.



Give the CD a name and click the **Next**




Click on **Finish**




When you add more, the files to the disc, they will be held in a separate are until the image is sent.

Note: In XP, there is no speed dialog for burning. This is a design defect.

If you had wanted to adjust the speed, that would have been done from the Windows Explorer. You would have right clicked on the CD/DVD drive and selected properties from the download tab.



From the properties dialog box select the recording tab. From the recording tab, you can select the recording speed you want. The problem with this, is that this takes control of the recording speed away from the other software that you may use to burn CDs.



Once you change it from fastest, all other burning software loses control. If you are doing this on someone else's machine, please remember to restore the CD's recording speed to Fastest.
